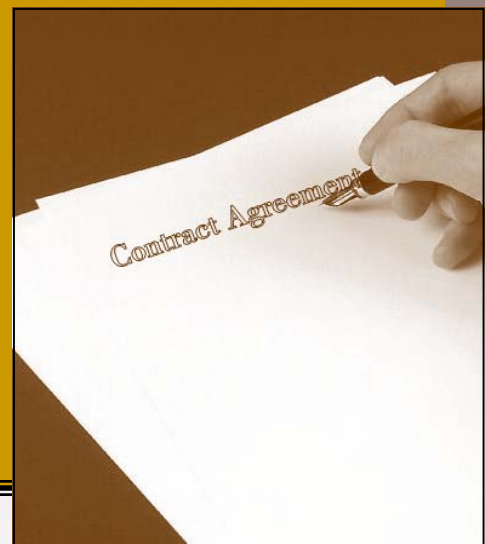

Accelerated Procedure: Process in which shorter advertising periods are acceptable due to urgency. Justifications, which usually apply to the public sector, are usually published as part of the tender notice. Extreme urgency can also be the justification for using the negotiated procedure. See *emergency purchasing*
